## What's Happening – Local Updates

While the economic downturn has caused certain changes in local planning and development, the effort to continue transportation and other infrastructure construction continues, and the WVHA Board will continue to play a role in representing Westside Village whenever it can.

To their credit, the Metro, Caltrans and LADOT project leaders conducting the Expo Line, the last phase of the I-405 widening project between the I-10 and SR-101 freeways, and the Overland Ave. widening project are sending out regular e-mail updates to the neighborhood councils, neighborhood associations and to individuals wishing to receive these updates. However, there will be unavoidable traffic impacts during their construction.

At this time, it appears that the Overland Ave. widening project and the DWP substation projects will be completed roughly in fall-winter 2010-11, with most of the remaining work done at night. The I-405 widening project and Sunset Blvd. Bridge reconstruction is also being done mainly at night, and local businesses are reporting good cooperation between the contractors, Metro and local neighborhoods to minimize the traffic impacts—the full project will require approximately two years to complete.

The Exposition Light Rail Line has recently completed some major technical, financial and legal hurdles and is estimated to open Phase 1 operations from Staples/Metro Center to La Cienega sometime in 2011, with operations extended to Venice/Robertson in 2012. A recently-opened Rapid Bus on Venice Blvd. is anticipated to shuttle many transit riders to/from the Expo Line to the beach when Venice/Robertson station is completed and ready for operations.

The Final EIR of Phase 2 of the Exposition Light Rail Line from Culver City to Santa Monica was recently passed, with four West L.A. stations planned at Palms/National, Exposition/Westwood, Exposition/Sepulveda and Olympic/Bundy. It is scheduled to be completed and operational in 2015-16.

However, there are certain options that the Exposition Line Construction Authority is evaluating during the next phase of construction, which is Preliminary Engineering. The WVHA Board recently voted to support a no-parking option with other mitigations for the Exposition/Westwood station in order to avoid traffic, parking and overzoning at that station (which would potentially lead to overdevelopment in adjacent Westside Village). The WVHA Board also voted to support an expedited and coordinated construction of the Expo Line with a long-planned Expo Bikeway to connect our region with both Downtown and the beach, and also voted to support an elevated rail bridge instead of a ground level

("at-grade") crossing for the Expo Line at Sepulveda Blvd. in order to reduce local traffic impacts for Westside Villagers.

After years of trying to limit the 3115 Sepulveda Blvd. (old Circuit City/Shoe Pavilion) developers to create a 3-4 story project at that site, and after successfully pushing the developers into an agreed-to development there complete with a traffic light at Sepulveda/Clover (near the old Baskin Robbins), the developers ran out of funds and the bank has taken back that site. It is indeed a pity that the developers hadn't agreed to work with us earlier, after two years of wasting everyone's time pushing for a 5-6-story, oversized project that would have led to overdevelopment on Sepulveda Boulevard!

Right now, no development is planned for the 3115 Sepulveda Blvd. site, which remains empty and problematic for our community. To make matters worse, the family-friendly Baskin Robbins has been replaced with a Cigarette Store, complete with hookahs, tobacco products and, arguably, other products that are anything but family-friendly such as knives and brass knuckles.

This turn of events speaks volumes about our economic downturn, and of the need to develop something favorable to Westside Village on Sepulveda Blvd. and prevent unwanted developments and businesses to change our neighborhood into a less family-friendly one that it now is. It also speaks volumes about our need to patronize our local restaurants, sandwich shops and yogurt shops. We do not want to lose any more stores like Baskin Robbins and Hamburger Hamlet!

On a final note, the local, state and federal political leadership is favoring a "30/10 Plan" to allow the federal government to give L.A. county a bridge loan of the next 30 years of sales tax receipts to pay for and construct projects such as the Wilshire Subway, the Expo Line and light rail to LAX in the next 10 years. Our infrastructure is continuing, but it is planning and community input that will make the final determination as to the character of Westside Village and adjacent neighborhoods for the next 20-40 years.

The Westside Village Homeowners Association and our neighborhood council, the Mar Vista Community Council, will continue to weigh in whenever it can to bring about the best possible results for our neighborhood, both for ourselves and for future generations.


